

## Night Sledding

Travel from Interlaken high into the Swiss Alps, take in the starlit winter panorama and then zip down the 1 hour long sled run. Along the way the trail winds through the woods, crosses alpine meadows and passes majestic frozen waterfalls. The sled run finishes at a small local restaurant where we enjoy an optional traditional Swiss cheese fondue dinner.

### Good to know

- Warm winter clothing is available to rent before the trip
- The dinner is traditional Swiss winter meal, Alpine Macaroni or similar
- 1 drink is included in the meal
- A traditional Cheese fondue meal is available for groups
- The track is unlit but participants will see well due to the white snow
- Each guests is given a flashing light on a lanyard
- There is a short training at the start and the guide then leads the group down the sled track from the front
- Frequent stops are made to regroup on the way down
- 4.6 km sled track
